Unaltered Dog Contract

As an addendum to our Adoption Agreement, paragraph 12. <u>Entire agreement; modification; Severability; Governing Law; Binding Effect</u>, we require that you read and sign this form in addition to our three-page Adoption Agreement:

First Responders Animal ResQ has adopted the Dog listed below to you without it previously having been spayed or neutered. In accordance with California Food & Agriculture Code Section 30503, we are required to collect a refundable deposit from the adopter and obtain written proof of spaying or neutering from the veterinarian performing the operation.

- 1. You agree to have the Dog spayed or neutered by this date:
- 2. You agree to pay a \$200 deposit <u>in addition</u> to the adoption fee. This deposit will be returned in full after we receive documentation that a veterinarian has performed sterilization surgery on the Dog. You have <u>ten days from date of surgery to mail</u>, <u>fax or email the documentation to us or you will forfeit the deposit</u>; see top of form for address, email and fax number.
- 3. If you do not have the sterilization done by the date above, you agree to make the dog available to us within seven days of the above date so that we may have the surgery done. We will pick up the dog, take it to the veterinary clinic, pay for the surgery, and return the Dog to you. You will forfeit your entire deposit if we take care of the surgery.
- 4. If a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in this state certifies that a dog is too sick or injured to be spayed or neutered, or that it would otherwise be detrimental to the health of the dog to be spayed or neutered, the adopter will furnish a letter from the veterinarian to FRAResQ stating what sort of medical condition prevents sterilization by the above date and also includes an alternative date. This is for medical conditions only and not for those wishing to spay or neuter a puppy at a later date.
 - We require puppies to be spayed or neutered at a maximum of six months from date of birth; not at some other age of your choosing unless you provide a letter from your veterinarian stating why and at what date the surgery will be performed. This may be no later than 12 months of age.
- 5. In addition to returning the \$200 deposit, we will reimburse the cost of the following medical expenses at prices listed below or your actual cost, whichever is less. All of these should be submitted at the same time as your sterilization documentation in order to receive reimbursement.

Spay/neuter surgery: \$125, rabies vaccination: \$20, bordatella vaccination: \$20, DAPP/DHPP vaccination: \$20, microchip implantation: \$40
